

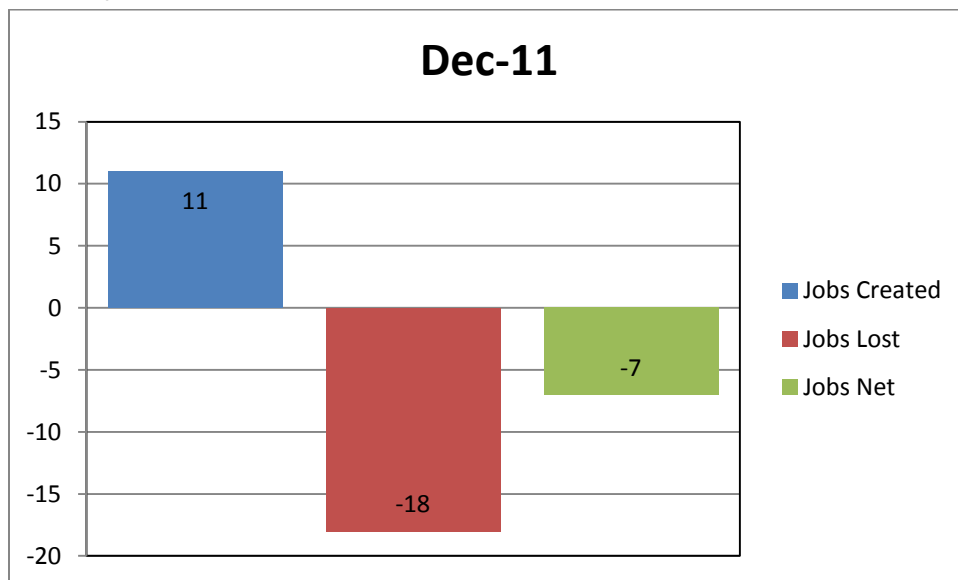
## December Results from the Sarnia Lambton Employer Survey

The Sarnia Lambton Workforce Development Board thanks the 69 employers who participated in our monthly survey regarding their workforce. The survey regarding January employment will be distributed on February 6 and close February 17. Here are highlights from the December 2011 survey.

14.5% of the employers were from the professional, scientific and technical sector, 14.5% were from the other services (except public administration) sector, 10.1% were from the retail trade sector, 8.7% were from the manufacturing sector, and 7.2% were from the education services sector.

Of the employers who participated, 66.7% indicated their employment remained the same, 15.9% of employers increased staff levels, and 17.4% decreased staff levels.

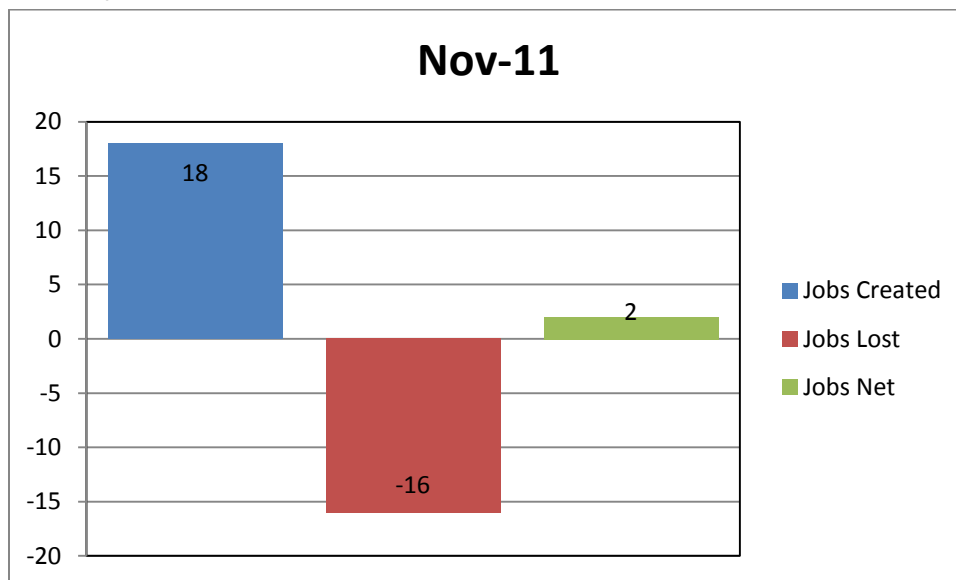
## November Results from the Sarnia Lambton Employer Survey

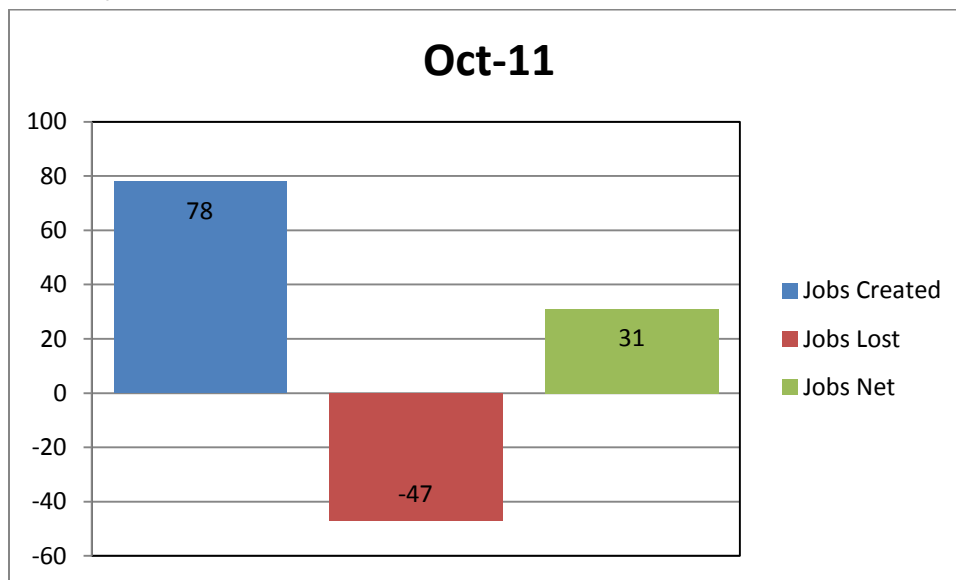
## October Results from the Sarnia Lambton Employer Survey

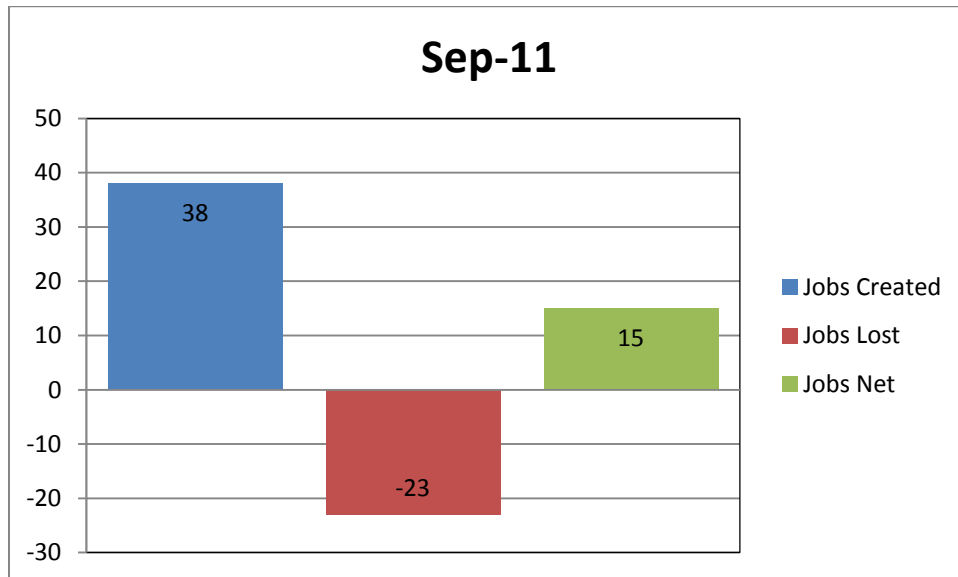
## September Results from the Sarnia Lambton Employer Survey

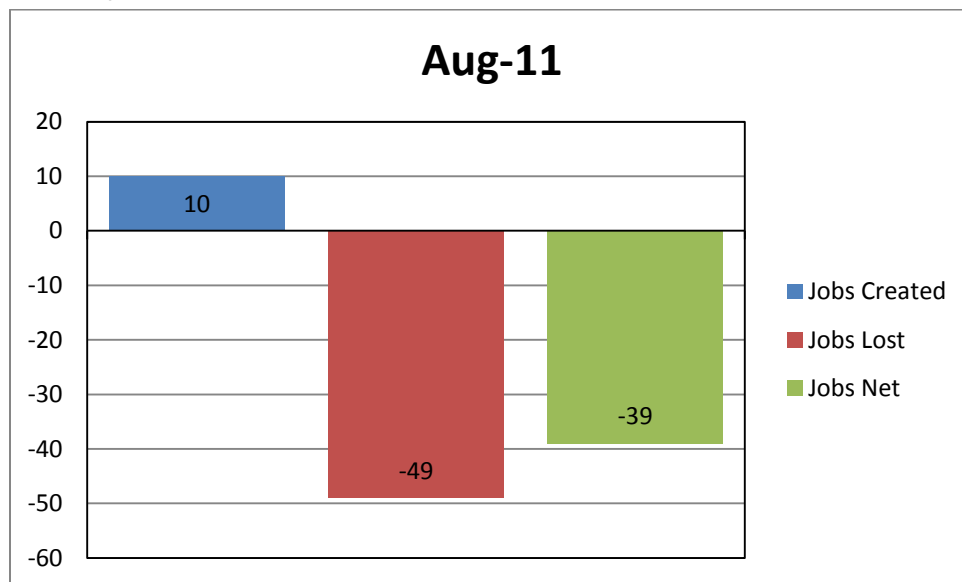
## August Results from the Sarnia Lambton Employer Survey

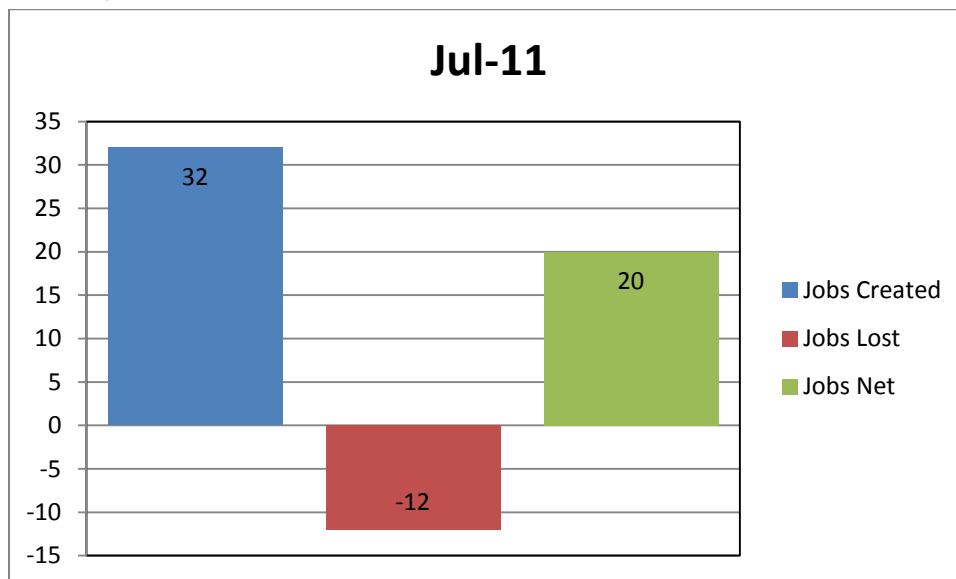
## July Results from the Sarnia Lambton Employer Survey

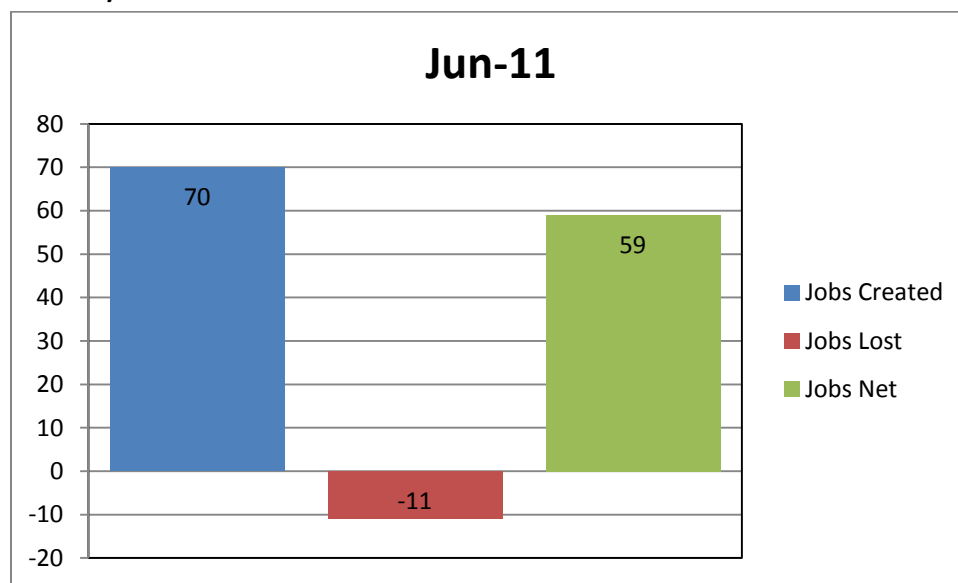
## June Results from the Sarnia Lambton Employer Survey
