

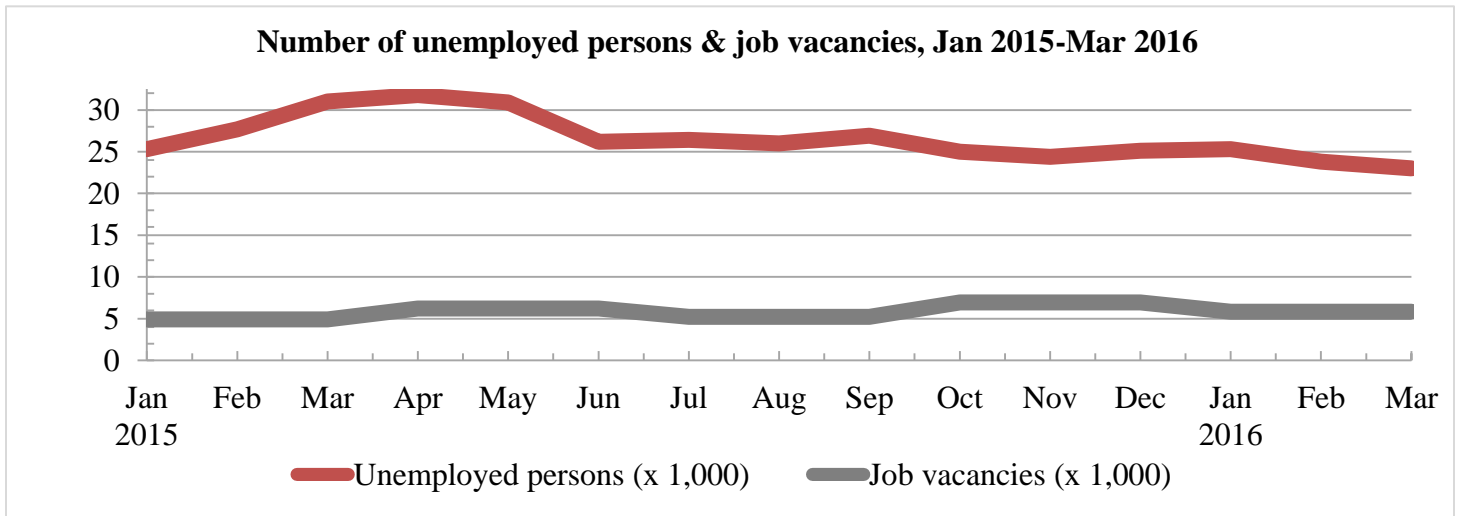
Jan-Mar 2016 Job Openings:

Job vacancies for the economic region

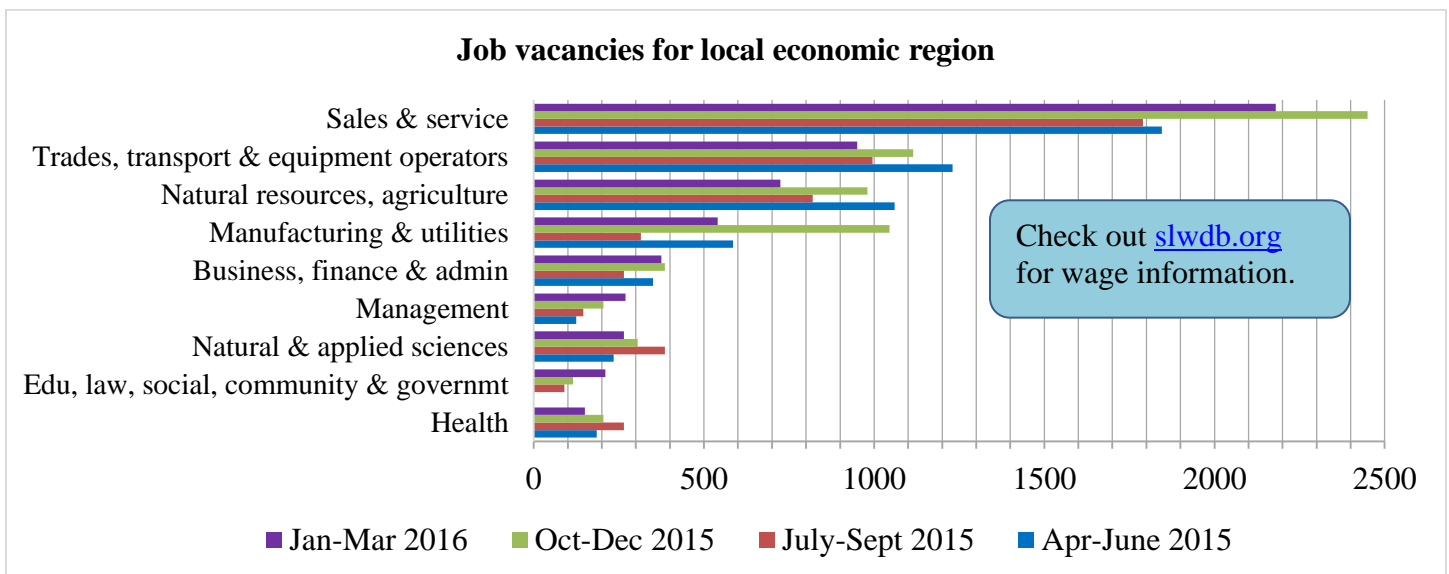

Statistics Canada publishes job vacancy data at national, provincial and economic region levels. **The local economic region includes Sarnia Lambton, Windsor Essex and Chatham-Kent.** This data is collected on a quarterly basis (every three months). Quarter 1 (January to March) results are in for 2016.

Between January and March of 2016, there were 5,830 job openings in the local economic region; up 18% compared to the same time period in 2015. In July, 2016 we reported that there were four unemployed persons available for each vacant position. This ratio has not changed for the first quarter of 2016.



The number of job openings by type of occupation is illustrated in the bar chart below. The top two job vacancies for the first quarter of 2016 include: Sales & service (2,180 openings) and trades (950 openings). Specific job titles are not available for the economic region but are for the province. For Ontario, the top sales & service related jobs include: food counter attendant/kitchen helper, retail salesperson and customer & info services (e.g., bank teller, call centre). The top trades job is motor vehicle transit driver (e.g., transport truck).
