HOW TO DETERMINE THE EQUIPMENT YOU NEED

- Ask your health professional about what equipment would help your condition.
- Check with your Community Care Access
 Centre case manager to determine if there
 is a service that might help assess your
 equipment needs.
- Ask for an assessment by a health professional who specializes in your needs, such as an occupational therapist, physiotherapist, orthotist, prosthetist, etc.
- Visit a supplier and ask to see equipment that may be available; they may recommend ways to be assessed for the equipment you need.
- Surf the web for sites that have equipment resources and for sites about your specific condition.
- Ask your local support services, associations and self-help groups about the equipment that other people have tried and found successful.
- Ask about trials for equipment to determine if you can try the equipment and see if it is best for you.
- Check references of any contractors.

ASSISTIVE DEVICES PROGRAM

What is the Assistive Devices Program?

 A funding program to help people with long-term physical disabilities get needed equipment and supplies.

What portion of the cost does it cover?

- Pays <u>up to 75 percent</u> of the cost of items like artificial limbs, orthopedic braces, wheelchairs and breathing aids.
- Contributes a fixed amount on items such as hearing aids for adults and breast prostheses
- Pays an annual grant directly to the person for some kinds of supplies, such as ostomy and syringes for insulin-dependent seniors.

Who can apply?

- Any Ontario resident who has a long-term physical disability and a valid Health Card issued in his or her name.
- You are eligible regardless of your income.
- Some items are restricted to certain age groups. Fact Sheets on each category of equipment specify any age limits and medical criteria that must be met.
- Does not pay for equipment available under Workplace Safety & Insurance Board or to Group 'A' veterans for their pensioned conditions.

How do I apply?

- Phone the information line. An agent can provide information and mail you fact sheets and an application.
- Fact sheets are available on each category of assistive devices. The Fact Sheet lists all of the items covered, the steps for applying for assistance and how to get the equipment.

It is recommended that you find out if a particular device is covered <u>before</u> purchasing it.

What types of equipment are covered?

Categories of the Assistive Devices Program are:

- Communication devices
- · Diabetic supplies
- Enteral feeding equipment supplies
- Hearing devices
- Orthotic devices
- Ostomy supplies
- Pressure modification devices
- Prosthetic devices
- Respiratory devices
- Visual devices
- · Wheelchair, Positioning and Ambulation aids

What types of equipment are not covered?

Examples are:

- Bath benches, geriatric chairs, grab bars, commode chairs, raised toilet seats, hospital beds
- Arch supports, shoe inserts, some types of braces, orthopedic shoes
- · Chair lifts or wheelchair lifts and ramps
- Air conditioners, air purifiers, humidifiers

Assistive Devices Program Authorizers

- Authorizers are health care professionals registered with the Assistive Devices Program.
- Assess whether you meet the program's funding criteria and help you decide which device is best for you.
- Describe the equipment you will need on the application form.

Where do I find an Assistive Devices Program Authorizer?

ASK

- · Your doctor or health professional
- Community Care Access Centre
- · Equipment suppliers

OR

 Phone the Assistive Devices Program for list of local authorizers.

Where do I find a supplier of my approved equipment?

- Usually you can get your device from a registered vendor who is approved by the Assistive Devices Program.
- If the device must be custom-made, you will be referred to a professional who is registered with the program.
- Most devices are covered only if they are bought from a registered vendor. The few exceptions to this are explained in fact sheets.

Who does the supplier bill for my equipment?

- Registered vendors bill the Assistive Devices Program directly for its part of the approved cost of your equipment.
- You pay your portion directly to the vendor.

Will the Assistive Devices Program contribute to the cost of replacing devices covered by the program?

- Certain conditions and minimum replacement periods apply.
- Replacement of equipment that is lost, stolen or damaged due to misuse before the minimum replacement period is up will NOT be covered.
- Clients are encouraged to buy insurance to cover the cost of replacement in these cases.

Some possible funding sources for your costs are:

- · Your insurance policy
- Government programs such as Ontario Works,
 Ontario Disability Support Program or Assistance to Children with Severe Disabilities
- Support organizations such as Easter Seals or March of Dimes. (Refer to support services section of this directory.) These groups may also contribute to the cost of devices not listed in the ADP manual.
- Municipal Social Services

HOME OXYGEN PROGRAM

What is the Home Oxygen Program?

 A funding program that pays for oxygen and related equipment and supplies for eligible Ontario residents

Who is eligible?

Anyone with a valid Health Card in his or her name who
has a chronic illness or dysfunction that requires long-term
oxygen therapy and who meet the medical criteria

Those not eligible are:

- In chronic or acute hospital care
- Need oxygen because of a work-related injury (contact the Workplace Safety & Insurance Board)
- Qualify for the Department of Veteran Affairs Group 'A' benefits
- Do not meet the medical criteria

What portions of the costs are covered?

You will receive <u>full coverage</u> of the monthly costs of a basic oxygen system if you are:

- 65 years of age or older
- Receiving benefits from Ontario Disability Support program, Ontario Works, Assistance to Children with Severe Disabilities, or professional services through a Community Care Access Centre or live in a long-term care facility

The costs covered include basic disposable supplies such as masks, nasal cannula and bubble humidifiers.

If you do not qualify for full coverage, you will receive <u>75 percent</u> coverage.

- You will be responsible for the remaining 25 percent.
- If you have private medical coverage, check to see if your insurance company will pay for charges not covered under this program.

How do I apply?

- Your doctor must complete a Home Oxygen Program application form and submit your oximetry test results.

How do I arrange for oxygen service?

- Call the Home Oxygen Program (phone numbers above) for a list of registered vendors.
- These vendors have agreed to follow the Home Oxygen Program policies and cannot charge more than the approved amount for oxygen and related equipment.

ASSOCIATIONS AND LOCAL SERVICE GROUPS

- Some of the Associations/Organizations and/or Local Service Groups may assist in equipment funding.
- Examples of some Local Service Groups are: Lions Club, Kiwanis Club, Moose Lodge, Royal Canadian Legion, Rotary Club, Kinsmen, Knights of Columbus.
- Examples of some Organizations are: Canadian Paraplegic Association, Easter Seals, Multiple Sclerosis Society, Muscular Dystrophy Association, Ontario March of Dimes, The War Amps, SHARE, etc.
- These organizations help people with disabilities in many ways. For example: financial assistance, finding assistive devices and helping to purchase equipment.

PRIVATE INSURANCE PROGRAMS

- Private health insurance programs may cover the purchase of equipment. Check with your insurer or employer for your policy details.
- If your injury/illness is related to a motor vehicle accident, check with your automobile insurance carrier for details on coverage.
- If your injury is work related, contact the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board (WSIB) for details on coverage.
- If you are a veteran or have provided war-related services, check with The Department of Veterans Affairs for coverage.

INCOME SUPPORT PROGRAMS

 If you are receiving income support from a specialized income program, you may be eligible for funding of equipment. Check with your income support contact or administrator.

Home Adaptation for Seniors Independence:

- The Home Adaptations for Seniors' Independence (HASI)
 program assists low-income seniors who have difficulties with
 living activities in their home by providing financial assistance
 to carry out minor home adaptations that will help them
 continue to live independently for as long as possible in their
 homes.
- The assistance is in the form of a fully forgivable loan of up to \$3500, which does not have to be repaid, provided the owner adheres to the conditions of the program.

The Residential Rehabilitation Program for Persons
with Disabilities (RRAP-D) offers financial assistance to
homeowners and landlords to undertake modifications to
eliminate physical barriers and imminent life safety risks,
and improve the ability to meet the demands of daily
living within the home. The dwelling must be occupied
or intended for occupancy by low-income persons with
disabilities.

STEPS TO TAKE BEFORE DRIVING AND/OR PURCHASING AN ADAPTED VEHICLE

There are certain steps that need to be taken before you begin to drive a vehicle that has been adapted or modified for special needs. The following steps should be taken:

Contact the Ministry of Transportation

- Phone your local Ministry of Transportation
- Some medical conditions may affect your ability to drive
- When you report a change in your medical condition to the Ministry of Transportation the ministry may ask to review your medical files

Arrange for a Driving Assessment

- Contact a qualified driver assessment facility to arrange for a complete evaluation (See Transportation Section)
- If you are planning to purchase a new vehicle with adaptive equipment, check with the dealership to see if the assessment center is approved by the dealership

Arrange for a Driving Assessment (Cont.)

- The evaluation should include an assessment on your driving skills and/or performance, hand/eye coordination, and general knowledge of driving an adapted vehicle safely
- The evaluation should also include a review of your medical history, driving history and driver's license status
- The assessment report should include complete recommendations on driving and a complete list of recommended adaptions for your vehicle
- Adaptive equipment is defined as equipment needed by persons with a disability to drive, enter, exit and/or be transported safely in a motor vehicle

Obtain Documentation from your Doctor

 Obtain a prescription or letter from a licensed medical doctor, confirming that vehicle modifications are necessary to enable you to drive

Purchase/Lease a New Vehicle or Adapt an Existing Vehicle

Arrange for Car Insurance

- You must tell your insurance company if you have an adapted vehicle to ensure that it is suitably replaced if you have an accident
- There is no special insurance needed for adapted vehicles

Arrange for Driving Training in your Adapted Vehicle

 Drive under the care of a qualified instructor until you can drive safely. (See Transportation Section)

Mobility & Financing Assistance Programs– New Vehicle Purchases from Chrysler, Ford, GM and Mazda Cash Back Program

May receive cash back up to \$1000 (GST included),

Mobility & Financing Assistance Program (Cont.)

- even if you have other funding assistance for your vehicle adaptations
- Your cash back may be combined with all other publicly offered incentive programs that are offered at the time of the purchase
- The cost of adapted vehicles for family members who transport a physically disabled person is also covered up to \$1000 (GST included)
- Each customer is allowed to buy 2 vehicles per year under these programs

What is not covered

- Regular production options available from the factory
- · Air conditioning and running boards

Changing over adapted equipment to a New Vehicle

- Ford and Chrysler will cover up to \$1000 (GST included) for the cost of changing over the adapted equipment to a <u>new</u> vehicle
- There may be restrictions; ask at dealership before buying or leasing
- General Motors does not cover the cost of changing over the adapted equipment

Applying

- Call customer service to locate a nearby dealership
- Call the dealership to check if it is wheelchair accessible
- Fill out an application from a Chrysler, Ford, General Motors or Mazda dealership or an adaptive equipment installer
- Adaptions must be done within 6 months. Adaption time frames may vary from Chrysler, Ford, General Motors or Mazda

After your vehicle is adapted Submit:

- Your approved application form
- · Licensed doctor's prescription and/or letter
- Vehicle registration
- · All paid receipts for adaptations of your vehicle
- You only have 60 days after completion of the adapted vehicle to submit your application. Completion time frame may vary from Chrysler, Ford, General Motors or Mazda

Maintenance:

Notes

Helpful hints for being organized about your personal health care:

- Write down Questions in a notebook or diary: Take your notebook with you to all appointments and write down the information given. If you don't understand the information given, ask your health professional to explain it more clearly.
- Keep a daily diary or log of symptoms: to help you and your health professional see patterns in periods of stable health and when flare-ups occur.
- Ask to have copies of assessment reports sent to you (or in care of your family doctor) and keep them neatly together in a binder. If many professionals are involved in your care, use dividers to separate each.
 - Note: You have the right to this information under the Freedom of Information and Personal Privacy Act, as well as under the Regulated Health Professions Act.
- Keep track of appointments in a calendar:
 When seeing a health professional, make sure
 you know when you should have your next
 appointment and set it up immediately. Most
 services require 24 hours notice to cancel or
 change an appointment.
- If you are on a waiting list for a particular service, explain your condition, and ask what you can do in the meantime.
- Or if they know of other services that can help you while you are waiting. Ask when they expect to be able to help you and write it down in your calendar along with their name and phone number. If you haven't heard from the service at that time, phone them to find out when they can help you.

Medically Essential Ambulance Trips

- If you are injured or very sick, the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care pay most of the cost of your air or land ambulance trip. You are responsible for paying \$45, if your trip is judged medically essential by the attending physician when you arrive at the hospital; or
- Your physician states in writing, before the ambulance is used, that your condition makes an ambulance necessary

Medically Non-Essential Ambulance Trips

You must pay \$240 for a land ambulance trip, or the full cost of an air ambulance trip (can cost thousands of dollars), if:

- The trip is judged not medically essential by the attending physician, or
- You do not have a valid Ontario Health Card.
 You may be exempt from any payment of an ambulance trip if you are:
- Receiving provincial social assistance, Home Care or are living in a facility licensed or approved by the Ministry of Health, or
- · Being transferred between hospitals.

Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP)

 A resident of Ontario must have a health card to show that he/she is entitled to health care services paid by OHIP

To be eligible, you must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or have immigration status as set out in Ontario's Health Insurance Act and
- Make your permanent and principal home in Ontario
- Be physically present in Ontario 153 days in any 12 month period

What's Covered by OHIP?

OHIP covers a wide range of health services. The following is a list of services covered in Ontario:

Physicians

 All essential diagnostic and treatment services provided by physicians are covered. This includes home visits and services provided in hospitals, where appropriate.

Podiatrists and Osteopaths

 Services are partially covered under OHIP. The ministry pays part of the costs and you must pay for the extra costs for these services.

Dental Services in Hospital

 OHIP pays for some dental surgery, including fractures or medically necessary jaw reconstruction, when done in the hospital. Prior approval needed.

Eye Care

- OHIP insures optometry services for:
- Persons (age 65+) once a year
- Persons (under age 20) once a year

What's Not Covered by OHIP?

Services that are not medically necessary such as:

- Cosmetic surgery
- · Transferring files to another physician
- · Telephone consultations
- Certificates of fitness to work
- Physical examinations for schools or camps
- Missed appointment fees

Other Information on OHIP:

- OHIP coverage normally becomes effective three months after the date you establish residency in Ontario.
- During the waiting period, it is recommended that you purchase private health insurance in case you become ill.
- If traveling to other provinces, most of your Ontario health coverage benefits can be used if needed. When traveling outside Canada, it is important to get private health insurance.

COMPLEMENTARY AND ALTERNATIVE MEDICINE

Complementary and alternative medicine describes an area of health care containing many different healing practices, some with ancient origins and some more recently developed. Alternative therapies are used <u>instead</u> of conventional medicine and complementary therapies are <u>used along with</u> conventional treatment. Complementary and alternative therapies usually have specific training requirements and/or certification courses and many are self regulated.

When considering complementary and alternative medicine it is important to <u>educate yourself about the therapy and the training requirements of practitioners</u>. Resources are available at your local library to provide more detailed information. You may wish to consult your family doctor or health professional to determine if the therapy will benefit you.

It is your personal responsibility to ask questions of the practitioner, such as:

- what training they have
- · where they were trained
- · regulating or governing bodies, and
- the number of years experience they have.

SELF REGULATED OR UNREGULATED HEALING PRACTICES

Some complementary and alternative medicine practices are:

Acupuncture is an ancient Chinese therapy in which fine needles are inserted into specific acupuncture points to treat a particular pattern of imbalance in the energy channels of the body.

Applied Kinesiology uses muscle testing to discover and correct imbalances in the body. Touch for Health and Balance Health have developed from Applied Kinesiology.

Aromatherapy uses essential oils extracted from the flowers, leaves, branches and roots of plants and trees to treat a variety of common ailments. Oils can be massaged into the skin, used in baths or inhaled.

Complementary and Alternative Self Regulated or Unregulated Healing Practices (Cont.)

Ayurveda is an ancient traditional medicine from India. The philosophy is that each individual is born with an individual balance of three forces that affect all mental and physical functioning. Treatments may include a detoxification program, changes to diet and lifestyle, and herbal remedies to restore the body to its individual balance.

Colon Therapy (colonics) uses water and herbs to cleanse and detoxify the large intestine or colon to remove accumulated wastes.

Craniosacral therapy is a gentle, non-invasive technique that evaluates and enhances the craniosacral system (which includes the brain and spine, and the membranes and fluid surrounding the brain and spine). Light pressure removes obstacles to the health processes and corrects the craniosacral system.

Herbalism uses plants for healing. The main purpose of herbal remedies is to stimulate the body's own healing abilities by rebalancing it and cleansing it.

Homeopathy is based on the principle that "like cures like." Remedies are selected to match the symptoms of the illness to trigger the body's own healing reaction.

Hydrotherapy or waterhealing uses water (hot or cold, fresh or salt or mineral) to treat a variety of conditions.

Iridology is a method of diagnosing physical or mental disorders by analyzing specific areas on the iris of the eye that correspond to zones of the body.

Complementary and Alternative Self Regulated or Unregulated Healing Practices (Cont.)

Reflexology works on the principle that reflexes or responsive zones in the feet and hands correspond to every part of the body. Manipulation and pressure to these reflexes is believed to restore normal function to the related body part.

Reiki is an ancient Tibetan hands on healing system that channels energy to promote the body's ability to heal itself.

Shiatsu is a traditional Japanese healing art of applying finger, thumb and hand pressure on traditional acupuncture points of the body to help balance energy flow, strengthen the vital organs and maintain health.

Therapeutic Touch is a healing technique where the hands lightly pass over the body to rebalance the energy fields.

Traditional Chinese Medicine is an ancient traditional medicine which aims to stimulate and rebalance body balance by diet, exercise, herbal medicine and by acupuncture.

Yoga originated in ancient India and is a personal development system that deals with physical, mental and spiritual health. Yoga consists mainly of simple stretching, breathing, meditation and relaxion exercises

Home Adaptation for Seniors' Independence

- A program that provides a one-time, non-repayable contribution of up to \$3500 for home modifications required
- Homeowners and landlords may qualify for assistance as long as the occupant of the dwelling where the adaptations will be made meet the following conditions:
 - Is 65 years or over
 - Has difficulty with daily living activities due to diminishing abilities brought on by aging
 - Has a total household income below the income limit specified for the area
 - Is a permanent resident of the dwelling unit which is to undergo adaptation work
 - The adaptations should be minor items that meet the needs of seniors with an age-related disability.
 All adaptations should be permanent and fixed to the dwelling. Examples could be handrails, lever handles, grab-bars and bathtub seats.
 Portable aides such as walkers and appliances are not eligible.

Income Support – Insured Payments for Loss of Earnings

 The Workplace Safety and Insurance Board will provide insured payments for loss of earnings if you miss time from work because of a work-related injury or disease.

Return to Work Program

To provide support, the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board:

- Monitors activities, progress and cooperation of the workplace parties
- Provides information to assist in assessing the work/ workplace in terms of the worker's functional abilities, employment skills and possible accommodations
- Suggests return to work resources available to the workplace parties
- Provides mediation services to the workplace parties to resolve disputes or issues regarding the return to work program.

Workplace Safety & Insurance Board (WSIB) (Cont.)

Labour Market Re-entry Assessment:

The Workplace Safety and Insurance Board will conduct a labour market re-entry assessment if:

- It is unlikely that the worker will be re-employed by the employer due to the nature of the injury
- The accident employer has been unable to arrange work that is consistent with the worker's functional abilities and that restores the worker's pre-injury earnings
- The accident employer is unwilling to cooperate in the worker's early and safe return to work.

Labour Market Re-entry Assessment includes:

 Determining a category of jobs that are suitable for the worker that is consistent with the worker's functional abilities, and reduces or eliminates loss of earnings resulting from the injury

Labour Market Re-entry Plan:

- The Re-entry Assessment will determine if a worker requires a labour market re-entry plan to enable a return to the labour market.
- If a plan is needed, it is designed to enhance the worker's existing skills or, if necessary, provide new skills.
- The plan may include: English as a second language program; academic upgrading; skills training; formal training; training in job search techniques towards the goal of finding suitable employment.

 - You have always lived in Ontario or Ontario is the past province you lived in for 12 consecutive months without being a full-time post-secondary student
 - If you are married or in a common-law relationship, your residency can also be based on the amount of time your spouse has lived in Ontario.
 - If you are considered a "dependent student", your residency can be based on the residency of your parent(s), step-parent legal guardian(s), or official sponsor(s).
- Must be enrolled or planning to enroll in an approved program at an approved post secondary institution
- Must be taking at least 60 per cent of a full course load, or 40 per cent if you are a student with a permanent disability

- Must not be receiving student financial assistance from any other province, state or country while receiving OSAP assistance

PRIMARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION

SPECIAL EDUCATION FUNDING

The Special Education Grant includes five components: the Special Education Per-Pupil Amount, the High Needs Amount, the Special Equipment Amount, the Special Incidence portion, and the Facilities Amount

Special Education Per Pupil Amount (SEPPA)

- Is based on a school board's total student enrolment
- Recognizes the cost of providing additional assistance to the majority of students with special education needs

High Needs Amount

 Provides for the intensive staff support required by the small number of pupils with very high needs

Special Equipment Amount

 Covers the cost of an individual student's equipment needs of \$800 in the year of purchase

Special Incidence Portion (SIP)

- Provides funding for students with exceptionally high needs who require more than two full-time staff to address health and safety needs
- Eligibility criteria for SIP are outlined in the document entitled Special Education Funding Guidelines: Special Equipment Amount (SEA) and Special Incidence Portion (SIP), 2006-2007.

Facilities Amount

- Provides funding for educational programs serving students who are receiving their education through facilities such as hospitals, children's mental health centres, psychiatric institutions, detention and correctional facilities, community living/group homes, and other social services agencies
- Provision of education in these facilities subject to agreement between school board and facility

Distance Travel Services (Cont.)

Via Rail - Escorts

- Passengers requiring assistance in tending to their personal needs (eating, medical care, hygiene) during their trip must travel with an escort capable of providing such assistance.
- When necessary, the escort is expected to assist VIA personnel in boarding and disembarking the passenger and helping the passenger move about while on board.
- The escort may travel free of charge in the same car and the same type of accommodation.
- To take advantage of the free escort privilege, the disabled person must present, for each trip a valid card from a recognized association or institution for the disabled or present a recent letter (max 9 months) signed by a physician and stating that the person cannot tend to this/these personal needs:
 - Assistance with eating, personal hygiene, medical care

Examples of special needs that should be discussed in advance are:

- Special meals and allergies
- · Passengers in wheelchairs or with reduced mobility
- Passengers requiring respirators, or refrigeration of medication
- Passengers with visual impairments
- Passengers using guide dogs
- · Passengers with hearing or speech impairments
- Passengers with developmental disabilities

Advanced Notice

- A minimum of 48 hours notice is required to prepare special services

Accessible Parking Permits

- Applications can be made by individuals living in Ontario or by corporations or companies that own or lease vehicles to provide transportation services to persons with disabilities.
 Temporary parking permits are issued for a maximum of 60 days in the following circumstances:
- At the time the application is submitted to a ministry Driver and Vehicle License Office.
- If a permit has been printed and mailed but the applicant has not received it
- Permits can be issued to out-of-province visitors for a maximum of six months.

- Your doctor is responsible to report to the Medical Review Board any medical condition or injury that may affect your ability to safely drive
- The Medical Review Board will send you a notice outlining that your license is suspended and you will be asked to complete a driving re-assessment within a certain time period, or your license will be automatically cancelled.
- Upon successful completion of the driving re-assessment and return of all necessary information, your license will be reinstated.
- You may not pass the re-assessment initially; special driving instruction may be recommended before another re-assessment; or it may be determined that you are no longer able to drive safely.

Senior Drivers - Driver License Renewal Program

- Drivers 80 years of age and over are no longer automatically required to pass a road test in order to re-new their driver's licenses.
- You will be asked to take a vision and knowledge test and participate in a 90-minute group education session.
- You may also have to take a road test. The counselor will make that decision at your education session.
- Contact the nearest Driver Examination Centre as soon as possible to take your knowledge and vision test as well as to book your education session.
 - You <u>must</u> complete these requirements before your current driver's license expires.
