You must be: at least 16, legally able to work in Canada, meet the educational requirements for your chosen trade, and have a sponsor in Ontario.

Find a sponsor through:

Employment Ontario supports, your network, Job Bank posting, Union Hall, guidance counsellor, college placement agency.

If you are 16, applications must be printed off and mailed out to the Employment Ontario Training Office.
